January 2023: Happy New Year! Joe Humble Award Winner: Mike McLaughlin Blacksmith Association of Missouri

"That's just crazy talk right there!" declared Mike McLaughlin. Mike was clearly surprised when it was announced that he had won the Joe Humble Newsletter Editor of the Year Award. The announcement was made via live stream in an awards ceremony that prefaced the BAM box raffle drawing during the annual meeting of the ABANA Board of Directors in Johnstown, PA.

Mike has been a member of the Blacksmith Association of Missouri (BAM) for 16 years and a member of ABANA for 15 years. He says that blacksmithing was something he was interested in for a long time, but he never really knew how to get started. A friend told him about BAM and then he ran into Ed Harper, the 2nd Vice President of BAM at the time, at a steam show a few weeks later. Mike went to his first BAM meeting a few weeks later and the rest is history. He signed up at Tom Clark's Ozark School of Blacksmithing and took the beginning class with Tsur Sudan. He's been forging items ever since!

When asked about his time as Editor, Mike said, "My goal is to give the membership information from the meeting that will help them learn a new skill or process. I include a lot of the member's work. Meeting trade items are a highlight. The different ideas will hopefully spark more creativity. BAM's goal is education for the members and the public."

A committee comprised of the past five Humble Award winners is responsible for nominating, deliberating, and eventually selecting the next Newsletter Editor of the Year. When his time comes to nominate another editor, Mike says he'll be looking for someone who represents their group well and who shares both new and old ideas. We asked what advice he would give to a brand-new editor.

"Record the meeting and take pictures if you can. It gives you a timeline and an order to the processes you are writing about. I am horrible at taking notes. Focus on what the members are doing. Remember that you have members just starting out so don't forget to include the basic skills."

For now, Mike is enjoying being an editor and hopes everyone gets something meaningful from every issue. He also points out that he is lucky to have a great support staff that helps with pictures and articles.
