February 2009

The February meeting was held at local area blacksmith William Bastas's shop located off of Pickle Road in South Austin.

Balcones Forge President Sue Murray opened the meeting on a very cold and windy (boy were we glad the coal fire was burning) day with general announcements about meetings and events in March. At the time of this publication the events at Rockdale and Fredericksburg, Tx have already been held.

About 60 people crammed into Williams' shop to watch him make a vase-like sculpture which stood about 10" tall out of a large piece of steel, and a very nice pair of tongs made out of railroad spikes.

William used power hammers to make these items as if they were an extra pair of hands. Very impressive work, indeed.

The trade item was a pair of tongs and 7 people made very nice examples which ranged from 2" long made from carpenters nails to over two feet long. There was no iron-in-the-hat auction.

Several people registered for the Bluebonnet Demo on March 28th; however to reduce the work load and to help in planning for the meals, people who have not registered are requested to pre-register as soon as they can in the next couple of weeks.
